

For the children and those young at heart



The world's largest Easter egg weighs in at 5,000 lbs. Standing 31ft tall and 18ft wide it is the world's largest Easter egg. Found in Vegreville, Alberta, Canada, the egg weighs a hefty 5000 lbs and took 12,000 hours to complete. Named the Vegreville Pysanka, the world's largest Easter egg is actually more of a jigsaw than a sculpture, as it is made from 3500 pieces of aluminum.



Pretzels are associated with Easter because the twists resemble arms crossing in prayer. From the 1950s, it was tradition for Germans to eat a pretzel and a hard-boiled egg for dinner on Good Friday

The egg itself is a symbol of Resurrection. Just as Jesus rose from the tomb, the egg symbolized new life emerging from the eggshell. In the Orthodox tradition, eggs are painted red to symbolize the blood that Jesus shed on the cross. In medieval times eating eggs were forbidden during Lent making them a real treat on Easter morning!
